Posting Your House Numbers Clearly Can Actually Save Your Life

Have you ever noticed how few homes have their house numbers posted prominently so they are easily visible from the street? Home owners rarely stop to think about why it might be important for their house numbers to be visible. After all, the mail carrier certainly knows your address, who else needs to know? These numbers are more important than you probably realize, and a lot of thought goes into making sure they are visible.



Many other people besides the mail carrier, the UPS delivery service, and the pizza delivery person need to know your address. **The most important people who need to know your address are the first responders who should be able to find your home when seconds count.**

Anytime first responders, police, fire or medical personnel, are responding to calls for service, their response time is reduced when addresses are conspicuously posted. These extra seconds could be the difference in the survival of victims. If your home catches fire or a loved one has a heart attack, Emergency Response personnel need to be able to find your home quickly. A missing or nearly-invisible house number can cost precious time in the event of an emergency. It can literally mean the difference between life and death for you or your loved ones.

The Lago Vista Building Code section 3.106 states:

(3) **Address.** All principal buildings shall have address numbers at least four inches (4") tall displayed in a prominent place on the front of such building or on a sign in the building's front yard, and able to be clearly seen from a street adjoining the property on which the building is located to identify the address to police, emergency medical service and firefighting personnel.

Posting house numbers on the mailbox is fine, but this should be in addition to a location near the front door.

1. Numbers should be visible from both directions of travel, as first responders may arrive from either direction. Check periodically to make sure that trees, bushes or shrubbery haven't grown up and obscured your house numbers on your house or mailbox.
2. Numbers should be a color that contrasts with the background. E.g. if your house is painted a dark color, the numbers should be a light color. They should not blend with the background. Brass and bronze numbers tend to be difficult to see on many backgrounds. One of the best locations is next to the front door because that's the spot officers and firefighters check first.
3. Numbers should be at least 4" high. The bigger and bolder, the better.

So stand in front of your home or business, if you can't see your address numbers, neither can first responders nor delivery people.
